8.1 Policing Cost Model

CAO Noreen Zhang reported to Council that should the policing cost model be rolled out in the near future, as per the Justice Department calculations, the policing cost for Wembley, based on population, would amount to \$35,455.00. Should the Province adopt this Model, there could be tax implications for our residents.

8.2 Update on Water Treatment Plant Flooding Issue

The insurance adjustor is asking for more information before the completion of his report. Regarding a temporary solution, CAO Zhang met with Helix Engineering, Councillor Johnson and Councillor McCallum, Mayor Turnmire and Ms. Ketchum, Public Works Foreman. As per their recommendations, Public Works will be monitoring the area throughout the Winter and will reassess in the Spring. Public Works will be grading and cleaning up the area.

8.3 Notice to RMA Insurance – Switch to AMSC Insurance

Ms. Zhang, CAO, explained to Council that switching to AMSC Insurance would benefit the Town of Wembley due to possibility of lower rates and an increase in level of service. By giving RMA notice does not necessarily mean we are automatically switching. Due to RMA Insurance being a reciprocal insurance, we have to serve RMA with a two (2) year notice. During those two years, if RMA lowers their rates and provides improved service, the Town of Wembley has the option to remain with RMA Insurance.
